
HISTORY: Bournemouth and Smugglers

Key facts

- In 1810, what is now central Bournemouth was little more than desolate heath land leading down to a wide bay and rugged shoreline.
- Dorset is a county in southwest England. It is known for the Jurassic Coast, a long stretch on the English Channel where the cliffs contain many fossils, and rock formations show millions of years of geological history.
- -Two prominent natural landmarks are Durdle Door, an ancient stone arch, and the layered cliffs at nearby Lulworth Cove.
- Lewis Dymoke Grosvenor Tregonwell was a captain in the Dorset Yeomanry and a historic figure in the early development of what is now Bournemouth.
- He was born in1758 in Anderson, Dorset, Tregonwell lived at Cranborne Lodge as the squire.
- Gulliver and his gang ran fifteen luggers to transport gin, silk, lace and tea from the Continent to Poole Bay and came to control the coast from Lymington on The Solent in Hampshire, through Dorset to Torbay in Devon.

Along the coast Smuggling was particularly rife. One of the most famous was Isaac Gulliver. He ran operations from Poole to Lyme Regis.
