armistice (verb)	An agreement by both sides to stop fighting while a peace treaty is negotiated.					
front line (noun)	The point at which the armies of each side met.					
Treaty of Versailles (noun)	The treaty between the Allies and Germany that ended World War I.					
trench warfare (noun)	A type of land warfare where each side digs long lines of trenches for protection.

Before **World War** II began in 1939, **World War** I was called the **Great War**, the **World War** or the **War** to End all **Wars**. 135 countries took part in **World War** I, and more than 15 million people died.

Some 75 million **people died in World War II.** For almost **six years** from <u>1939</u> to <u>1945</u> Britain fought the toughest war it had ever experienced. World War II was total war - every person, every business, every service was involved. Britain did not fight alone, as the war also involved many countries - World War II involved **61 countries** with 1.7 billion people (three quarters of the world's population).
